Plan review

- We've almost completed an entire first review of plans yay!
- 1st review vs. 2nd review
 - 1st review = what are these plans are focused on
 - 2nd review = extracting more detailed info on quantitative objectives and what the threats are to the features
 - Will help the next step of building out conceptual models once we refine the list of our conservation features
 - Conceptual models will be the bridge from qualitative to quantitative and help us communicate (Miradi is great for this)
- Do we have a system for condensing the features we've found in these plans?
 - Some on the leadership team expressed feeling overwhelmed when looking at the plan summary sheet
 - Usually this happens during in person meetings, which we will not be able to have - we need to be creative on how to make this participatory
 - Action: Natalie will send out a doodle to select a 2 hr time block to discuss condensing features
 - Maybe we pull out the most popular species and then classify by habitat type?
 - Aubin and Danielle would be good to consult about this
- How to be culturally and socially inclusive?
 - See how participation goes on the next couple of calls and then set up individual follow up if needed

Feature selection and conceptual models

- Max number of conservation features = 12 -15 ideally
- Action: natalie will start looking for existing conceptual models for cold water salmonids, connectivity and 5 needle pines
