"There is no word for 'extinct' in the Ktunaxa Language. Let's keep it that way!"

- 1st hand experience as a beginner and now teaching. Remember feeling good about picking up new words /phrases.
- Bring ideas on new tools and methods
- Teaching my children and family at home.
- Now teaching students at college and try to be encouraging in all interactions and correspondence.

Students Outcome

- Grades vs. language retention
- Correct pronunciation
 - Pronunciation of the sounds can change a word considerably.
 - It's not just about saying the right words, but about saying the right words correctly



World View

- Our language places us in the world. Our way of being comes first, followed by the linguistic skills of relaying that sense to others.
- We can teach students to say Kootenay words, but teach a way of seeing the Ktunaxa is
